THE FEAST OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS

Our Lady of Sorrows is a Catholic title for the Blessed Virgin Mary, referring to her suffering and sorrow during the Passion and death of her son, Jesus. Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows is centered on meditating on her "Seven Sorrows," which include events like Simeon's prophecy, the flight into Egypt, the loss of Jesus as a child (when Mary and Joseph lost the young Jesus in the Temple for three days, meeting Jesus on the way to Calvary, the Crucifixion, the taking down of Jesus' body, and his burial. The Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows is celebrated on September 15th, and devotion to her is believed to bring various spiritual benefits, including increased virtue and consolation in times of pain.
